Safety Camera Access Report Update

The March safety camera monthly access report is now available; there were no incidents reported. The report is compiled by the safety chair or another designated member of the special committee. It includes the number of footage requests received, the number of requests approved or denied, camera locations accessed and the dates/times for which the footage was provided. (The report does not reveal personal information unless the requesting party is a law enforcement agency representative.) Key Bridge Collapse - How To Help

The collision/collapse of the Key Bridge on March 26th was a tragedy for Baltimore and many are wondering if there is anything they can do to help. Two fundraisers were setup to help. The GoFundMe page by the Latino Racial Justice Circle raised over \$98,000 in less than nine hours and has shut down their page and is asking that those wishing to donate send money to the Key Bridge Emergency Response Fund set up by the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs at https://www.baltimorecivicfund.org/key-bridge-response-fund.

Sip & Plant Swap and Cycle Tour - April 28th

Celebrate Earth Day and Spring at UFPIA's Sip & Plant Swap and Cycle Tour on April 28th. The event will kickoff with an optional bicycle ride at Noon and will tour some of Baltimore City's hidden green spaces and will end at the UFPIA community garden (1827 E Pratt). Snacks and beverages (by donation) will be available at the UFPIA garden from 2-4pm.



Bring a plant (indoor or outdoor) to exchange for something else to take home. Plants can be brought in any type of container (such as a cutting in a bottle or with roots in a box or bag, etc.) but be sure to note the name of the plant and what type of care is needed (shade or full sun, frequent watering, etc.). This is a free event; donations are appreciated. Kids are welcome with an adult but no pets are allowed. (Note: The goal is to beautify the neighborhood, so the planter should be placed in the front of your home and not in the back.)

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF IS OPEN MAY 3-4, SEPT. 6-7 AND OCT. 4-5 FROM 9AM-5PM; AND JUNE 7-8, JULY 5-6 AND AUG. 2-3 FROM 9AM-7PM. (2840 SISSON ST.)

BULK TRASH AT MOST LOCATIONS (OR CALL 311). PROOF OF CITY RESIDENCY REQUIRED.

GARBAGE:

ALL TRASH MUST BE IN A CAN WITH A TIGHT FITTING LID - NO LOOSE BAGS. Pickup on Wed. put curbside at 6:00pm+ on Tuesday night. If a holiday, pickup on Sat. (Tip: If lid is separate, tether it to the can with string or cable tie.) City ordinance mandates that cans cannot be stored on sidewalks. Up to 96 gallons per building (including multi-units) or up to 5 clear or labeled bags of yard waste (leaves, weeds, and branches up to 4" thick or 3' long). (Note: Rats chew through plastic and love to eat dog poop so be sure to pickup after your pet-and it's the law!)

RECYCLING:

NO plastic bags at all (including as a container)!

Pickup on Friday. If a holiday, pickup usually on Sat. Items must be clean and dry. All paper and cardboard and cartons (no napkins and paper towels); metal food and beverage cans (no hangers); glass bottles and jars (no light bulbs, dishes, or window glass); plastic bottles, jugs and jars (no bags, straws, yogurt or carryout containers, rigid plastic utensils, plastic rings, or housings). Polystyrene (Styrofoam) is not accepted - put it in your regular trash.



Notes: To be eligible to vote or to run for office, you must have paid your membership dues (based on the calendar year beginning in January), be age 18+, live in our boundaries, and have attended at least 2 of the last preceding 11 meetings and/or attended Association sponsored events/activities. (Dues are applied to the year they are collected and are considered paid at collection for the remainder of the year and through the regular Association meeting in January of the following year.) Members eligible to vote who are not present at a properly called Association meeting may vote if their absentee vote is received by an officer before the meeting, specifies the decision or election in writing, and is signed by the absent voter (email is fine). Recap of March 2024 Community Meeting

Guest Speakers:

- 1) Nan Nawrocki, Executive Director from Sail Baltimore, discussed the upcoming MD Fleet Week & Flyover which returns to Baltimore from June 12-18th. The ship tours, festivals, flyovers and educational activities will take place at the Inner Harbor, Fell's Point, North Locust Point, and Martin State Airport. The ships will begin arriving on June 12th and will be open for public tours from June 13-17th from 10am-5pm unless otherwise indicated. The flyovers of modern and historic military and civilian aircraft will take place June 15-16th over the Inner Harbor (no Blue Angels). Volunteers are needed to help during the event too. 
Officer/Committee Reports:

- **-Beautification:** 1) Dumpster Day/Cleanup on April 6th. 2) Planters for sale (see page 1 for more). **-Community Garden:** Half of the new raised bed boxes have been completed and filled with soil. The rest will be completed in the fall and/or early next year.
- **-Education**: 1) No more volunteers were needed for the Commodore John Rogers Career Fair on April 9th; thanks to everyone who volunteered. 2) Wolfest is coming (more info. on page 1).
- **-Fund-raising**: Work on the new Billie Holiday mural on the 200 block of S Durham is to begin in April with a celebration following the mural completion so stay tuned!
- **-Land-Use**: The LU Committee meets monthly at the Julie Community Center and incorporates the Safety and Traffic & Parking Committees.
- **-Safety:** 1) The installations of café lights are almost completed. Extra funds will be used for spare light bulbs. 2) There are 15 safety cameras available but only 10 signed MOUs, with only 5 cameras installed (Pratt Liquors, The Jungle Room, Bement & Sons, Benders Tavern and Ann St. Grocery). Some of the limitations for installation are due to building structures and internet connections.

April Is National Garden Month

It was established in 1973 by the National Garden Clubs, Inc. to promote gardening and horticulture education. Be sure to use only organic soil and fertilizer, plant flowers that are helpful to our pollinators (i.e., not hybrids as most of their flowers are sterile and do not contain pollen and/or nectar, which is their food) and something that blooms during all of the seasons. By following these steps, pollinator conservation can be adapted to any location, no matter how small. (Stop by our Sip & Plant Swap on April 28th to purchase a planter at a discount or pickup some free plants too!)
